Torah Message from Rabbi Moldovan

Yisro appears on the scene with the Jewish people and immediately criticizes his son-in-law Moshe's leadership of the Jewish people. "It is not good what you are doing" says Yisro bluntly. He advises Moshe to delegate his responsibilities to capable judges who can refer the difficult cases on to Moshe in order to maximize the usage of his time. Hashem agrees with the recommendations of Yisro and commands Moshe to set up a judicial system for the Jewish people. The greatness of Yisro came from his critical eye. As a newcomer to Judaism he had the ability to assess the leadership of the Jewish people and point out faults that needed corrective action. This same trait is what led Yisro to Judaism - as an idolatrous priest he rejected every religion in the world until he came to Judaism (Rashi 18:11). Criticalness is a lofty attribute that enables one to arrive at the truth, but before we go about criticizing others we must first criticize and examine our own actions. Yisro was well versed in scrutinizing his way of life and rejecting the falsehood therein, so his criticism of his son-in-law was not viewed as a slight of honor but rather as honest advice
