Torah Message from Rabbi Moldovan

The Shabbos before Pesach is known as Shabbos Hagadol (the big Shabbos) due to the great miracle that occurred on this day. Hashem informed the Jewish people in Egypt that they were to sacrifice a sheep, revered as a god of Egypt, in broad daylight and visibly to the Egyptians on the night of the 15th of Nissan, which we now know as Pesach. This sheep was to be purchased on the 10th of Nissan and kept in the house for four days until the sacrifice. The commentaries ask why we were commanded to buy the sheep at all and why so far in advance. Would it not have been enough to be commanded to sacrifice the sheep and leave it to our own designs as to how and when we were to acquire the animal? The commentaries explain that on the night of Pesach the Jewish people were redeemed from being a nation of lowly, indentured slaves and elevated to be Hashem's chosen people and the centerpiece in the perfection of the world. Such a significant and noble responsibility requires its bearers to be a people of great stature and discipline. On the eve of the nation's great transformation, Hashem was beginning to train the Jewish people in the trait of discipline. To hold the god of the Egyptians for four days in front of their eyes must have been harrowing. The Egyptians would be ready to massacre the Jewish for forsaking their deity and the Jewish people were tempted to speed up the process and just sacrifice the sheep as soon as possible. Hashem wanted the Jewish people to feel a need to act and suppress their urge until the green light was given. The more one acts on controlling his urges in the present, the more control he wields over them in the future. Discipline was the first lesson given to the Jewish nation and a message for all generations.

Shabbos Hagadol Drasha Rabbi Moldovan will present the Shabbos Hagadol drasha before Mussaf on Shabbos at approximately 10:30 am. The drasha will be aimed at acquiring clarity regarding modern Pesach issues such as Pesach hotels, kitniyos and quinoa, hand and machine matzah, and the extent of cleaning necessary for Pesach.
