Please remember to recite "Baruch hamavdil bein kodesh l'chol" in order to end Shabbat before driving or doing other work that is prohibited on Shabbat.

Torah Message from Rabbi Moldovan The 8 unique garments of the *Kohen Gadol* are enumerated in *Parshas Tetzaveh* - the *Meil* (robe), *Kesones* (tunic), *Ephod* (apron), *Avnet* (belt), *Choshen* (breastplate), *Tzitz* (headplate), *Mitznefet* (turban), and *Michnasayim* (pants). The *Choshen* was the means by which the *Kohen Gadol* could receive an answer from Hashem to issues of *Halachah* and guidance in Jewish conduct. A piece of parchment with a question would be placed between the fold of the *Choshen*. Engraved letters on the stones of the *Choshen* would light up to spell out the heavenly response. The *Choshen* was the address for the most difficult cases of Halachah. The *Choshen* was worn "on" ("al") the heart of the *Kohen Gadol*, or above his heart to symbolize that, the pursuit of justice must extend beyond the feelings of one's heart. A righteous judge may be swayed to go with his feelings over his honest judgement in a case between a rich person and a poor person - the wealthy party should probably forego that money

for *tzedakah* anyway! The Torah teaches that we must always use our objective senses when analyzing a Halachic situation. Sensitivity for the plight of the poor and the depressed is of extreme value in the Jewish system of ethics but it shrinks in comparison to the ultimate value of the pursuit of truth and justice and a consistent and unbiased legal system.
