SHABBAT SHIUR & MINCHA

We invite you to join us for the Rabbi's Shabbat shiur at 7:20 pm, followed by Mincha services at approximately 8:05pm (see the sidebar for times). The topic for this week's pre-Mincha class is "The Kashrut of wine handled by a non-Jew." Come early and join in the interesting discussion.

TORAH MESSAGE FOR PARSHA NASSO

One who makes a Nazirite vow must abstain from wine, cutting his hair, and from coming in contact with a corpse for the duration of his vow. He is to hold himself at a higher level of holiness and purity than the common folk. The commentaries ask why he must separate from wine. What's wrong with wine? We drink wine at Kiddush on Shabbat, we drink wine on Yom Tov, we drink wine on Purim, and we drink wine at every Bris and wedding! Wine is associated with so many important Mitzvot. Why should a Nazir abstain? The commentaries explain that a Nazirite vow is not appropriate for every individual. Rather, it is designed for one who is too heavily involved in the physical world and wine. In order to wean himself off alcohol He needs to go cold turkey for a period of time in order to return to normalcy. Even though alcohol has many positive aspects to it, an Alcoholics Anonymous member is encouraged to go cold turkey for at least some period of time until he is able to return to alcohol in moderation. Judaism promotes moderation with all physical pleasures including alcohol, but when one has lost control of himself there is often a need to take an extreme stance in order to return to that moderate attitude. This is why a Nazir can't drink wine.

A facility preparing non-Kosher food in close proximity to Kosher food requires an increased level of supervision. A world renowned expert in the field of Kashrut (Rabbi Zushe Blech) was brought to the campus to provide guidelines to legitimize the standards of Kashrut. The guidelines of his report have not been implemented as of yet by the management of the

Home. We are still hopeful that these guidelines will be implemented, but until they are accepted and clearly implemented I cannot re

commend any part of this facility. I will keep the congregation posted with any new developments.
